Please indicate, in some way, the ten words in your composition. Bold, or highlight (not in yellow). Do not use italics.

The words here are listed in the order in which they appear in the original text, in the FORM in which they appear. But remember, you can change that.

Minimum: two pages. Maximum: four pages. Double-spaced.

In your composition you must also include:

- 1. ONE use of a colon

- 4. TWO examples of parallel structure (really good ones no single-word lists)

You must **CLEARLY LABEL** each of your examples. Footnotes work well.
